

# AIRLINE BIKE CHARGES\*

The majority of airlines follow the recommendations of the IATA when charging for luggage, using a maximum 'linear length' of 158cm, which is much smaller than a standard bike box. As such, they don't consider bike boxes to be standard luggage and you'll need to add sports luggage on top of any other charges.

Bike luggage costs differ from airline to airline so to make things simpler we've created this handy infographic to let you know what to expect when taking your pride & joy overseas.
